The Next Generation Air Transportation System (NextGen)¹ is a multibillion-dollar, multi-year infrastructure effort aimed at modernizing our Nation's aging air traffic system to provide safer and more efficient air traffic management. As a complex undertaking, NextGen encompasses multiple programs, procedures, and systems at differing levels of maturity. Section 502 of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Reauthorization Act of 2018² (the act) mandates that FAA report on the Agency's progress on implementing NextGen programs and the risks to implementing these programs, as well as program funding, milestones, benefits, oversight, and lessons learned. FAA submitted this report to Congress on December 21, 2021.

The act also requires that the Department of Transportation's (DOT) Office of Inspector General (OIG) review the accuracy of FAA's report on its implementation of NextGen, describe any concerns with the information, summarize prior concerns and pertinent OIG recommendations, and provide any other information that OIG determines appropriate. Accordingly, our audit objectives are to (1) assess FAA's report on its implementation of NextGen and (2) report the status of OIG's NextGen recommendations.
