In 2022, there were nearly 43,000 motor vehicle traffic fatalities—a 14.2 percent surge since 2017. Additionally, over 5,500 large truck and bus fatalities occurred in 2022 and have remained above 5,000 annually since 2017. To help prevent and minimize crashes and their effects, the Department of Transportation (DOT) issued its National Roadway Safety Strategy (NRSS) in January 2022. The NRSS is a collaborative effort between the Office of the Secretary of Transportation and the surface transportation Operating Administrations (OA) and includes priority actions in pursuit of five core objectives: Safer People, Safer Roads, Safer Vehicles, Safer Speeds, and Post-Crash Care. According to the NRSS, implementation of priority actions includes launching new programs, coordinating and improving existing programs, adopting a foundational set of principles to guide the strategy, and providing decision makers with a broad understanding of the value of NRSS priority actions to help prevent crashes.

We are initiating this audit due to DOT's new and comprehensive approach towards traffic safety and its goal for the NRSS to help decrease fatalities over the next few years. Our objective is to evaluate DOT OAs' implementation of NRSS priority actions, monitoring of progress, and measurements of success.
