Over 3.3 billion tons of hazardous materials (hazmat) are transported annually across the United States. Recent hazmat transportation related incidents highlight the important roles emergency preparedness and response play in hazmat related incidents. The Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) is responsible for advancing safe hazmat transportation. The Agency administers several hazmat safety grants to State, local, and tribal governments for emergency planning and first responder training.

The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)¹ authorized PHMSA to provide over \$46 million in annual grants from hazmat shipper and carrier registration fees² collected under the Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) Fund. This amount represents a significant increase from prior awards. In fiscal years 2022 and 2023 respectively, the Agency awarded grants from the HMEP Fund of approximately \$29.8 million and \$28 million.³

We are initiating this audit due to the significant increase in hazmat grant funds authorized under IIJA and the significant roles these grants may play in preparing for and responding to emergency hazmat incidents. Our audit objective will be to evaluate PHMSA's collection and monitoring of hazmat registration fees, and the

² Each hazmat transporter must file a registration statement and pay an annual fee that is deposited in the HMEP Fund. Using these fees, the fund supports three types of grants—Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness grants, Hazardous Materials Instructor Training grants, and Supplemental Public Sector Training grants.
